

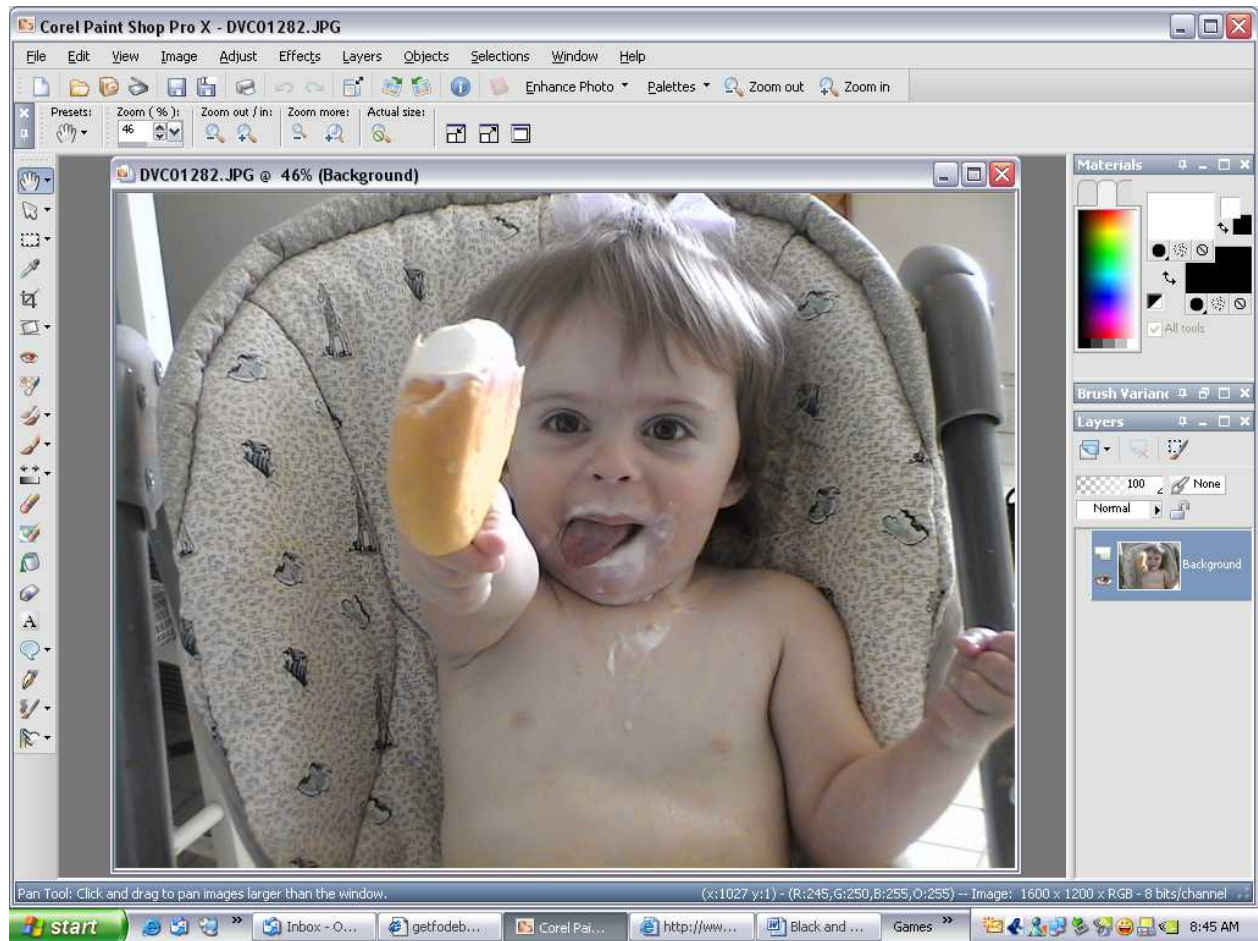
COLOR ISOLATION TUTORIAL

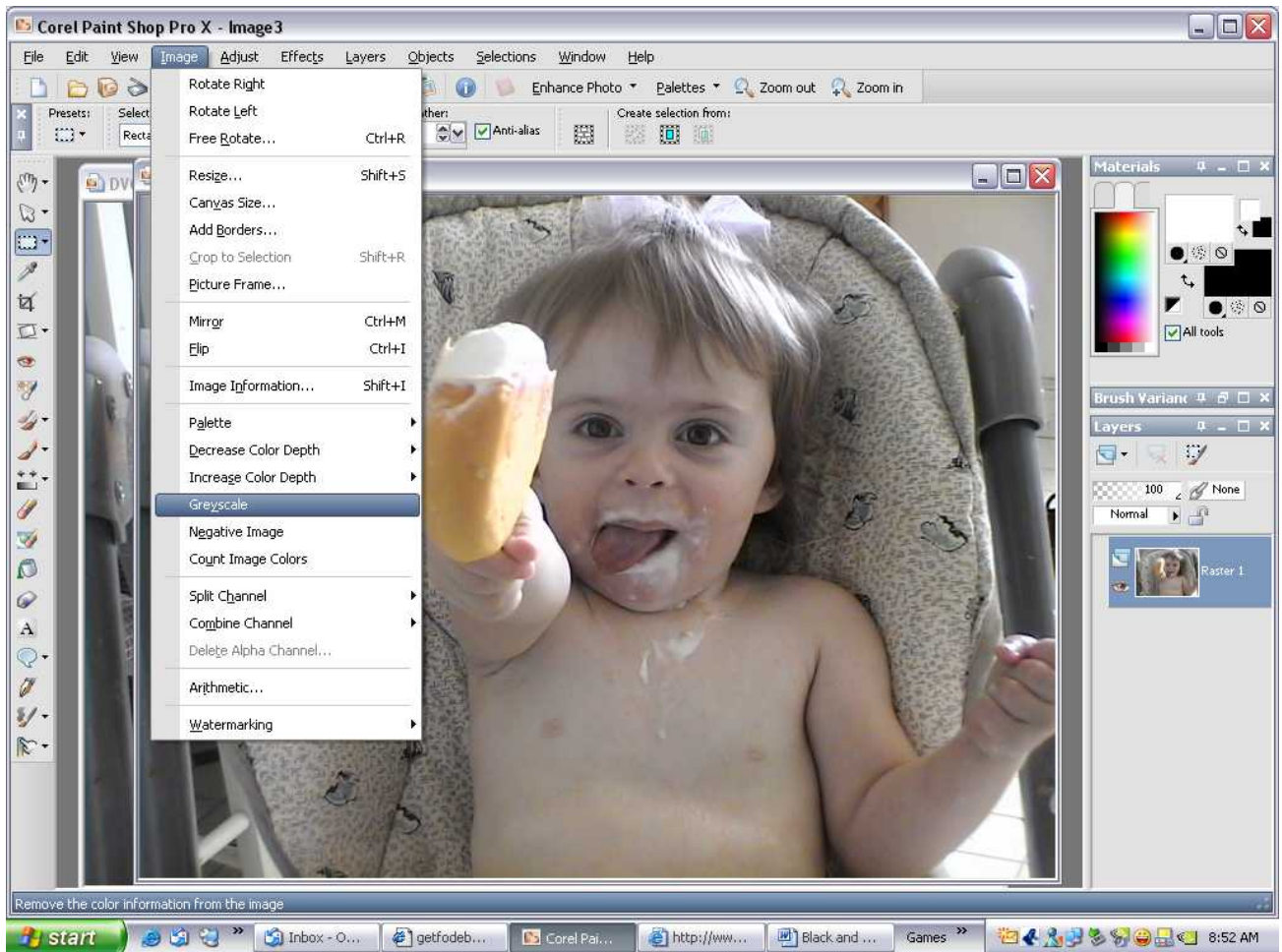
This tutorial will show you how to have black & white photos with a splash of color.
This tutorial is done in Corel Paintshop Pro X but is compatible with previous versions of Jasc Paintshop.

To start, open the picture you want to re-color.



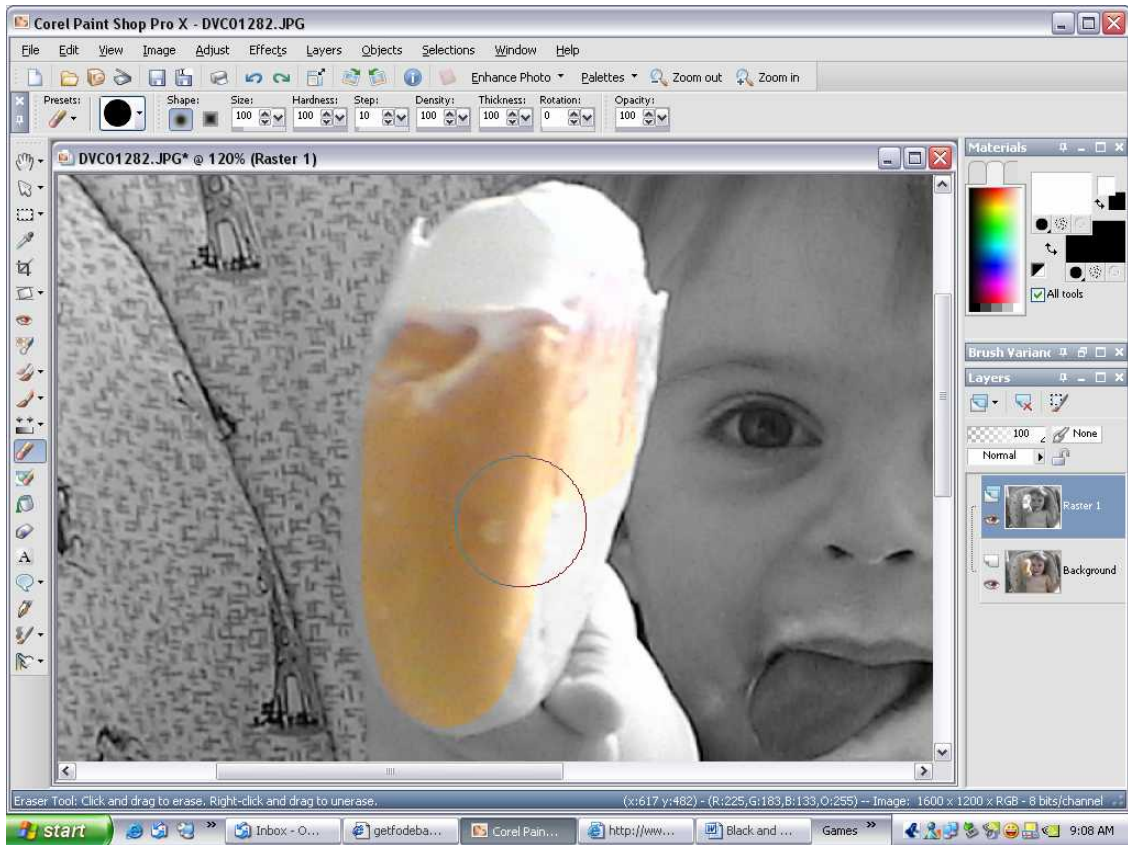
You're going to copy the image and paste as a new image so that you can turn the copy black & white. Shortcuts are going to become your best friend in Paintshop. Use Ctrl A (select all), Ctrl C (copy selection), and Ctrl V (paste as new image).

So now you have the copy of the picture on top. Go to Image at the top, and then select grayscale.



The copy should now be black & white. You'll want to use shortcuts again & copy it to your original picture. Ctrl A, Ctrl C and then go back to the original picture and do Ctrl L (copies as a new layer on your original). You're now ready to bring in the color.

Whip out your eraser tool and erase away what you want to be in color. You'll have to play with the size of the eraser and zoom in and out of your picture to get detailed.



When you're finished, you should have a great black & white photo with a pop of color!
